Pond A8 Notch Construction

Celebrating the creation of vital wetland habitat

The water district and its partners will soon launch important habitat restoration work at Pond A8 near Alviso. When completed, the Pond A8 Project will connect the former salt pond to the tidal waters of Alviso Slough via a 40-foot concrete "notch" structure, creating 1,400 acres of open-water habitat and up to 200 acres of tidal wetland habitat for a variety of species including fish, pelicans, cormorants and ducks.

Depending on contaminant and levee scour monitoring, Pond A8 will eventually become salt marsh, creating habitat for the endangered California clapper rail, the salt marsh harvest mouse, and other marsh species. The project will also generate significant construction-related employment in the South Bay.

Environmental impact documents on the \$1.9 million project were completed in December 2007, with design completed in July 2009. The construction phase is scheduled to begin in January 2010, with notch construction to be completed by September 2010. Final project construction is scheduled for completion in December 2010.

The Pond A8 project is funded by the water district, the control board, and a generous federal stimulus fund grant administered by NOAA. The project is part of Phase One of the South Bay Salt Pond Restoration Plan. the largest tidal wetland restoration effort on the west coast. When plan implementation is complete, more than 15,000 acres of former industrial salt ponds will be transformed into important wetland habitat, enhancing the environment, expanding recreational opportunities and increasing the flood protection capacity of Alviso














Directions to the parking location:

From the North Bay: 580 East to 880 South. From 880 South take 237 West. Take the Great America Parkway exit toward Lafayette Street. Turn right onto Gold Street Connector/Great American Parkway. Continue to follow Gold Street Connector. Turn left onto Gold Street. The World Financial Group buildings will be on the left, at 2099 Gold Street.

From the South Bay: 880 North to 237 West. Take the Great America Parkway exit toward Lafayette Street. Turn right onto Gold Street Connector/Great American Parkway.
