Eden Landing

Phase 1 Actions in north end of pond complex

Interspersed with managed and tidal ponds and historic features

Coordinated with Bay Trail spine and staging area being built under separate project (885 acre restoration site)

Provides new "entry" and access to Eden Landing complex

Kayak/Boat Launch

Access to Mt. Eden Creek – Bay and hunting access under lottery system (launch site near new staging area at Eden Landing entrance)

Salt Works Trail

Year-round access trail from Mt. Eden Creek staging area to historic salt works with interpretive station



South Bay Salt Pond Restoration Project

Archimedes Screw

Interpretive loop trail between Ponds E13 and E14 to view managed ponds and historic remnants

Alviso Pond Complex

Viewing and interpretive stations at Pond A16
Bay Trail spine segment between Sunnyvale and Stevens Creek

Bay Trail Spine

Stevens Creek Levee Connection (2.5 miles segment between Mountain View and Sunnyvale Treatment Plant staging area)
