# Final EIS/EIR and Overview of Changes

#### **Basic Elements of Final EIS/R**

- Project approach is unchanged.
- Alternatives B (50:50) and C (90:10) have only minor changes.
- Phase 1 has only minor changes.
- Funding has been and will continue to be key to implementation.


# Major Comment Areas (continued)



# Changes in Final EIS/R

- The Corps no longer a co-lead agency.
- A Public Access Adaptive Management staircase diagram added.
- A figure displaying the DESFBNWR acquisition area included.







# Other Changes in Final EIS/R

- PG&E facility modifications that are needed because of restoration will be incorporated into the Project.
- A preferred alternative, Alternative C, has been identified for legal reasons, but the document re-emphasizes the Adaptive Management nature of the Project.
- Invasive Spartina best practices included.




#### Summary of Invasive Spartina Best Practices

- No breaching where invasive spartina, hybrids, seeds and/or propagules are likely to get into the Project Area.
- No introduction of non-native seed or propagules into the Project Area.
- Ensure that dredged materials brought to the Project Area do not contain non-native seed or fragments.
- Variations to the best practices may be appropriate based on site-specific conditions and scientific analysis.



# Overview of Phase 1 Actions and Schedule





# **Phase 1 Eden Landing**

- 630 acres of tidal habitat restoration (E8A/9/8X)
- 230 acres of enhanced shorebird habitat (E12/13)
- 3.8 miles of new trails and a non-motorized boat launch area
- Viewing areas of new habitat and historic salt-making facilities



#### Phase 1 Alviso

- 360 acres of tidal habitat restoration (A6)
- 570 acres of muted tidal restoration (A8)
- 240 acres of enhanced shorebird habitat (A16)
- 2.5 miles of new trail in the Bay Trail system (near Moffett Field)



#### **Phase 1 Ravenswood**

- 240 acres of enhanced shorebird and snowy plover habitat (SF2)
- 1.4 miles of improved trail
- Viewing areas of new habitat and historic salt marsh

# Water Resources Development Act of 2007

- Enacted over President's veto
- Specific Shoreline Study provisions
- General crediting provisions



### **WRDA 2007 - Shoreline Study**

- Report due to Congress in 3 years
- Report shall include recommendations "based on planning, design, and land acquisition documents" prepared by SCC and others
- Crediting provisions



# WRDA 2007 Shoreline Study Crediting

- "The cost of work performed by the non-Federal interest in preparation of the feasibility study that is conducted before the date of the feasibility cost sharing agreement; and
- The funds expended by the non-Federal interest for acquisition costs of land that constitutes a part of such a project and that is owned by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service."



#### WRDA 2007 - General Crediting

- A partnership agreement ... may provide ... credit toward the non-Federal share of the cost of the project, including a project implemented without specific authorization in law, the value of in-kind contributions [integral to the project] made by the non-Federal interest, including--
  - The costs of planning (including data collection), design, management, mitigation, construction, and construction services;
  - The value of materials or services provided before execution of the partnership agreement, including efforts on constructed elements incorporated into the project; and
  - The value of materials and services provided after execution of the partnership agreement.
